## Genesis

Mr. Abboy Naidu, an agriculturalist from Vallam Village near Cheyyar, ardently believed that education is the best tool and perhaps the only tool for the advancement of an individual and the society.

With this in mind, Indo-American College was established in August 1998 by Abboy Trust named after M. Abboy Naidu. The Trust has been mostly funded by the Indo-American Foundation Inc. California, U.S.A. to improve Education in rural India. The foundation has built many school buildings and donated them to public schools.

## Policies and Guidelines of the College Democracy

Indo-American College (IAC) is a non-bureaucratic, transparent, classless and a seamless institution. No one is considered superior than the other. The students, the faculty and the administrative staff will work together and are free to express, interact and discuss their viewpoints without fear.

Freedom of expression and freedom to dissent will be an integral part of IAC. No one shall be penalized for expressing an opinion or asking questions.

## Rules and Regulations

From time to time IAC will formulate rules and regulations along the lines of the policies and guidelines of the College and will be notified to all concerned. These rules and regulations will be fair and reasonable and will be enforced to maintain the just interest of the students and the proper functioning of the college.

The principles of fair hearing and due process will be honored whenever disciplinary action is taken. The affected party shall have a right to appeal and be heard by an appropriate committee so constituted representing the interest of all (students, staff and administrators) concerned.

### **Division of Responsibilities**

The Principal shall be primarily responsible for managing the interest of the students and the faculty of the College. She/he shall administer the office with kindness and compassion while maintaining order and discipline.

Disciplining the students and the faculty is a dual responsibility of the Principal and the administration. One must always consult the other.

### **Proper Channel**

While “proper channel” is necessary in most part for orderly routing, processing of information and decision making, all members of the college shall have direct access to everyone else.

### **Formalities**

IAC does not believe in formalities. Students, faculty members, the Principal, and administrative staff may interact informally and discuss any matter of mutual interest at any location and at any time so that they are comfortable. For example, a teacher may request the Principal for vacation holiday or sick leave in the hallway. This, of course, must be followed by a written request.

### **Saluting the Teachers, the Principal and Administrative Staff**

Saluting has evolved as a tradition after the former rulers of India to recognize and greet individuals. If it promotes hierarchy, authoritarianism and regimentation, IAC believes that it should be done away with. Students, Teachers, Principal and the administrative

staff need not greet each other by saluting nor do the “higher ups” should expect such salutes. It is perfectly acceptable to offer Vanakkam, Namaste or Namashkar in the traditional Indian manner. Instead, one may gently bow the head down, offer such greetings as good morning etc. or simply smile to greet others.

## **Transfers**

In the pursuit of happiness, growth, self improvement and self preservation or for any other reason the staff and students may request transfer to other institutions, locations, courses or entirely other fields. They will be treated as anyone would want to be treated in a similar situation. IAC would provide help for orderly transition wherever and whenever possible.

## **Student Discipline**

IAC believes that the best form of discipline is self-discipline. It will bring, peace, harmony, happiness and help higher levels of academic achievements.

The Principal and the Teachers are responsible for maintaining discipline in the College campus. Disciplinary action including dismissal shall be imposed on students responsible for disruptive activities depending upon the severity of their acts. Acts of grievous nature done outside the college premises will also be considered when taking disciplinary action.

Inappropriate and indecent remarks, vulgarity in speech and action, intimidation, threats, exploitation of weaknesses and acts of similar nature will be considered serious violation of the codes of the college and will be dealt with severely. The punishment will range from simple warning to expulsions from the College.

## **Plastic and Smoke Free Environment**

In the college campus the usage of plastic is banned and the campus should be maintained Clean and Smoke free.

## **Antiragging**

There shall be no ragging. Students found ragging shall be dealt with as per the rules laid down by the Govt. of Tamilnadu. This may result in dismissal besides imprisonment and payment of penalties. As per the government rule the college has a committee for antiragging and the students can submit their grievances to the committee.

## **Damage to the College Property**

Damage to the College property or stealing by anyone including the students, the faculty and administrative staff will be dealt with seriously and Charges for the damages will be recovered fully.

## **Cleanliness**

Cleanliness of the College premises is everybody's responsibility. Keeping the toilets clean is as important as keeping prayer room/hall clean.

Separate toilets are provided for the male and female students. Segregation of the toilets based on the titles is unnecessary.

Betelnut chewing and spitting, smoking and chewing gum and strictly prohibited in the College premises.

## **Dress**

The students, the faculty and the administrative staff can wear any dress that is decent, clean and is deemed appropriate. There shall be no restriction in the style and color of the dress. There shall be no uniform.

## **Punctuality**

The students, faculty and the administrative staff shall maintain punctuality.

## **Cheating in Tests**

Cheating in examinations, tests and other assignments is considered to be a serious violation of the College policies. Severe disciplinary action will be taken, if proven, according to the established norms of the University.

## **Holidays, Sick leaves and Vacations and Other absence**

Holidays will be observed as per the Government/University norms and may be modified under special circumstances. Sick leaves and vacations and other absences shall be granted based on their genuine needs. None of the authorities shall use this as a tool to control, punish, intimidate or harass those who make such a request.

## **Comments and Suggestions**

Comments and suggestions to improve the functioning of the College are always welcome. There will be a suggestion box in the premises. Comments and suggestions may also be made anonymously.

## **Attendance**

1. Every student should attend a minimum of 85% of the total working days.
2. All leave applications must be countersigned by the parent or guardian and must be recommended by the Head of the Department.
3. The Students absenting continuously for 15 days without a valid reason and proper leave application will be expelled by the Principal.
4. Students suffering from sickness for more than 5 consecutive working days shall produce a valid Medical Certificate.

5. Parents of those students who are irregular in attendance and who frequently absent themselves and those with less than 85% of attendance will be notified for their irregularity by post.

## **Scholarships**

The College awards State Government Scholarship to the students belonging to Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe Classes provided by District Harijan Welfare and Backward Class officer, Thiruvannamalai. To be eligible for this scholarship, the beneficiary should have 90% attendance.

## **Academic Year**

The year is divided into two terms for the purpose of fee collection.

- I Term – June to December
- II Term – January to April

## **Term Examinations**

1. To evaluate the performance of Students in their subjects, Test and Examinations will be conducted periodically.
2. The Marks secured by the students in the Examinations will be communicated to the parents through post.
3. Students who fail to attend the tests will be severely dealt with.

## **Associations**

Various Department Associations are formed with a view to bring out inherent talents of the students. The Principal is the Ex-officio President of all the Associations. He/She may nominate any staff as Vice-President and students as Secretaries of the Associations at the beginning of the Academic Year. All the students are the members of these Associations.

Associations may organize lectures, debates and discussions on topics of interest.

## **Cocurricular and Extracurricular activities**

In order to inculcate social responsibility among students and to make the students good citizens, our College offers Social clubs like National Service Scheme, Youth Red Cross, Red Ribbon Club, Consumer Club, Eco Club... etc.

## **Library**

1. The Library is open to all members of the College.
2. The Library shall remain open from 8-30 A.M. to 4-30 P.M. on all working days.
3. Students will be issued Two Books at a time. They have to return them within 14 days.
4. Books are to be treated and handled with great care. No one is allowed to sub-lend the books.



5. Transfer Certificate, Conduct Certificate or Hall ticket shall be issued to the Student until he/she returns all the books and pays the outstanding dues to the College.
6. Strict silence should be observed in the Library.

### **Admission / Withdrawal**

Application for admission shall be submitted in the prescribed form available in the college office on payment of the cost. All candidates who seek admission should produce Transfer Certificate, Conduct Certificate and Mark statements from the institution last studied.

In case of withdrawals, the Transfer Certificate will be issued on written request from the student Countersigned by the parents and on production of “no dues certificate” from the office, Library and all the departments concerned.

### **Transport**

The Management operates Bus and Van services for the convenience of the students coming from distant places. Information regarding the routes and fares can be obtained from the college office.

### **Visitors to the College**

Visitors are not permitted to go to class rooms or staff room directly. They are also prevented from roaming inside the campus. They should approach the college office and if necessary, it will arrange to meet the staff-member or student.

### **Changes to the Guidelines**

In the interest of the College, the above guidelines may be modified or changed at any time without any prior notification by the administration. There shall be no appeals challenging the validity or reasoning behind those modifications or changes.
